


The Southwest Indian Agriculture Association (SWIAA), The University of Arizona College of Agriculture and Life Sciences -Cooperative Extension, and the Navajo Nation Department of Agriculture are hosting the 2015 Southwest Indian Agriculture and Family days on June 16, 17, &18, 2015 at the Twin Arrows Resort and Casino in Northern Arizona. The 2015 Southwest Indian Agriculture and Family days will provide information, regulations, and opportunities for successful operation and management of resources associated with livestock and farm production and marketing.

The Southwest Indian Agriculture Association was formed as a non-profit organization in 1987 to bring Native American people together to promote and educate for agriculture and agri-business on tribal lands throughout the southwestern United States. SWIAA has held annual conferences and livestock field days over the last 25 years as a volunteer organization.

The University of Arizona -College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, through their Cooperative Extension serves as a statewide network of knowledgeable faculty and staff that provide lifelong educational programs for all Arizonans. They are part of a nationwide educational network of scientists and educators who help people solve problems and put knowledge to use.

The Navajo Department of Agriculture (NNDA) is established under the Division of National Resources within Executive Branch of the Navajo Nation. Today, the Navajo Nation Department of Agriculture is the lead agency in planning, coordination, and management of all programs, policies and regulatory provisions designed to protect and preserve Navajo rangelands, livestock and agricultural resources.

Together these three entities' have come together as one cohesive planning committee to bring all Native American people a two and a half day conference dedicated to Agriculture, and all that it entails. The Planning Committee is appreciative of your interest in our youth, agriculture, and natural resources; and your assistance in the form of sponsorship, donation, or booth purchase will help offset the costs associated with the conference.
